Swami Bodhananda is the Chairman and Spiritual Director of Sambodh Society Inc in the US, and the Sambodh Foundation and its sister organisations in India. In United States the headquarters of Sambodh is in Kalamazoo Michigan which has an Ashram in a wooded area of thirty-two acres, and in India the head-office is in New Delhi. These organisations and its mandate are inspired by the teachings and guidance of Swamiji. Swamiji teaches Advaita Vedanta, Yogasutras, Bhagavad Gita, Upanishads and scores of other Vedantic texts. Swamiji's teachings are imbued with a quality that at once takes the novice listener and the committed student to the sacred space of the higher self.

In India Swamiji has trained many students and guided them to the pinnacle ashrama of Sannyasa. Some of these students are today well-known Sanyassins in Kerala and other cities in India. Swamiji headed the “Sandeepany Sadanalaya” in Kerala.

In India there are twelve Centres of Sambodh that work under the spiritual guidance of Swami Bodhananda. Of these one of the most beautiful Ashrams, with a full-fledged facility for its guests and students to stay, is located in the banks of a river in a place called Kalady in Trivandrum, Kerala. Folklore says that Adi Sankaracharya had visited Kalady in Trivandrum.

Another Ashram which is situated in the outskirts of Bangalore, “Sambodh Centre for Living Values” is guided by Swamiji teachings for a green, self-sustained and simple living. The Sambodh Centre in Bangalore has its focus in tree planting, medicinal farms, organic farming, protection of cows, and helping the poor and the downtrodden through its charity programmes. Every year studious but underprivileged school students are selected for the Sambodh scholarships that support their education.

Apart from his erudition in Vedantic texts, Swamiji is a well known management guru, having his master's degree in economics. He is an avid reader and is well-versed with the contemporary challenges that the corporate leadership and corporate management face. Swamiji heads the “Bodhananda Research Foundation for Management & Leadership Studies, a registered Trust which has its office in Trivandrum, and which spearheads Swamiji's lectures and programmes in the area of management. Swamiji's management lectures are sought after in India, having authored the first ever book on Indian management on "Gita and Management" in 1994. Swami Bodhananda is the author of several books: His latest book is *Indian Management and Leadership* (2007). Other books include *Management and Mahabharata* (2011), *Meditation: The Awakening of Inner Powers* (1994), *Happiness Unlimited* (2000), and a monograph titled, *Rishi Vision*. He has also authored two conversation-styled books, one with a scholar of consciousness studies in India, and the other with a young Indian-American lawyer in the United States. These books are “Dialogues: Philosopher meets Seer” (2001) and “Irreverent Questions” (2004). Swamiji's Meditation book has recently been revised and is accompanied by a recording of several guided meditations that complement the text. His third major book, *Self Unfoldment in An Interactive World* (2001) presents an innovative rendering of this timeless topic.
